

Dress Code for Confirmation Mass

The official color of Confirmation is red. They aren't required to wear red, but many choose to anyway. They **will** be required to wear nametags that will either have red paper or red font.

Girls' dresses should be "church appropriate." They need to be at least knee length, and shoulders need to be covered. They shouldn't be too tight or revealing. Monsignors have been known to ask us to find a sweater or t-shirt to cover girls who are not covered enough. That is very embarrassing for them. In order to avoid that, it's important to be very careful about clothing choices. If you want to bring in a dress to see if it is appropriate, you may do so and we can approve it for you in advance.

Girls may wear pants if they want, but remember that they need to look like they are attending a nice event. A Sacrament. Please make sure that they aren't too tight or revealing.

Boys need to wear a nice shirt and a tie. If they want a jacket, they are welcome to wear one, too. The tie needs to be church appropriate, too. Sponge Bob doesn't count as "church appropriate."
